

1. Chromebooks **CAN** be used as QR code readers, but it's a bit cumbersome. Have the kids go to the launcher (that's the **O** in the bottom left corner of the screen. Type "scan QR chromebook" and the top result will be "ScanQR – Chrome web store." Tap on that, and choose "Add to Chromebook" Since our chromebooks don't have forward facing cameras, it makes scanning a little awkward but 3-5 should be able to handle it. Ask Shaun for a demo.
